GENERAL NEWS Where the Money Goes?

In the 1st quarter newsletter from 2019, we looked at the path that money follows when given to mission. In each subsequent newsletter in 2019, we highlighted an organization in Missouri that benefits from our giving. In the 4th quarter newsletter from 2019, we highlighted what it meant to make a pledge to mission which is the first and largest of the five channels of giving. You can see from the chart above how individual contributions in each category combined with the contributions of others across the conference become a significant offering.

Each quarter this year in this section, we will be focusing on one of the remaining of the five channels of financial giving.

Special Mission Recognition

Another of the five channels of giving is the Special Mission Recognition. Each year, members are invited to nominate recipients for a Special Mission Recognition pin. Money for the purchase of these pins is set aside as part of the UMW unit budget. This money is not taken from the Pledge to Mission.

Nominations usually come from the list of members of UMW, but often included are men from the church or women who may not be UMW members who are supportive of the work of UMW and have contributed time and energy to the mission of the organization.

Names of the recipients and the year(s) recognized are listed in the back of our UMW yearbook. Recipients in 2019 were Pat Martin, Suzanne McDavid, Mary Ouart, and Marsha Sergent.
