In 2022 Sophia Circle collected donations for Festival of Sharing during the months of January through July. Festival of Sharing is a cooperative response to hunger, poverty, and injustice in Missouri and beyond. When people of faith come together and share, we can make a positive and powerful difference in lives of our neighbors. Missouri United Methodist Church again responded with great generosity for this mission to help people in need.

We couldn't do this project without the cooperation of individuals in addition to Sophia Circle members. David Lawson assisted with promotion, bulk ordering of items for the kits, and keeping track of orders and statistics for us. The students of College Age Ministries under the leadership of Rebes Bennett did a terrific job of packing and taping the 134 food boxes. Sophia Sisters with some spouses and family members packed 280 personal hygiene kits. The Youth Ministries (MUMY) students and director Christina Fletcher assembled the 85 Reading and Writing Kits. At a suggestion of Pastor Troy, everyone attending Welcome Back Sunday on August 28 was invited to help pack the 524 Student Dental Kits as an all-church activity. It was a great success as helpers of all ages packed the kits in record time. In the future, we hope to include more packing events open to anyone who wants to participate.

On Saturday, October 8, a majority of our donations will be delivered to the FOS ShareFest at Tipton, MO. Some of the donations were delivered to the Missouri Area United Methodist Conference Center for distribution to other ShareFests throughout the state. When the boxes are unloaded in Tipton, it will show an impressive expression of giving and will help fulfill the growing needs of Missourians in poverty and distress.




