


Please note that Wesley Circle has moved their meeting time to 1:30 pm.


We couldn't do this project without the cooperation of individuals in addition to **Sophia Circle** members. **David Lawson** assisted with promotion, bulk ordering of items for the kits, and keeping track of orders and statistics for us. The students of **College Age Ministries** under the leadership of **Rebes Bennett** did a terrific job of packing and taping all **378 food boxes**. As seen in the photos, Sophia Sisters helped pack dental kits, personal hygiene kits, and baby bundles with helpful spouses **Bill Mees** and **Gary Beahan**, and Nancy's cousin **Linda Skouby**. The **Youth Ministries (MUMY)** students and director **Becca Griffins** assembled the **150 Reading and Writing Kits**. **Don Gruenwald** also assisted numerous times with details and assistance at the church.

After the kits were packed, **Robert Floyd** helped by loading and moving 100 of the completed food boxes to the **Missouri United Methodist Conference Office**. On Saturday, September 25, the boxes were loaded into a U-Haul trailer and three additional vehicles to deliver to the **FOS Ingathering** at Tipton, MO. Another helpful Sophia spouse, **Steve Cheavens**, saved the day by pulling the trailer with his truck to Tipton and back. We couldn't have completed this **FOS** mission without the cooperation of these generous and caring people. When the boxes were unloaded in Tipton, it was an impressive expression of giving and will help fulfill the growing needs of Missourians in poverty and distress.

current membership stands at 168.






Masked & socially distanced but united in fellowship!


Justice, I want to remind you that the next Just

United Methodist Women:

Turning Financial Gifts into Miracles for Women, Children and Youth

UMW SUNDAY

United Methodist Women's Sunday will be observed at all three services –

8:00, 9:30, 11:00 –
on Sunday October 10, 2021.
During the services, the observance of Candle Burning will be held.



The practice of candle burning is a long-standing tradition among United Methodist Women. Each year a Sunday is named to honor the work of United Methodist Women locally, nationally, and internationally. Especially noted is the mission work that is done by the organization. The national office of UMW calculates the amount of money that is needed to provide mission each year down to the second. In 2021, the amount is \$20.23 per minute. The tradition of the Candle Burning ceremony is to offer donations to mission in honor or in memory of someone close to your heart, or to the work of mission in general. When those donations are received, the total amount is divided by the mission minute amount named for the year and the candle is burned for that number of minutes. The observation of candle burning is a beautiful way to contribute to the mission work of United Methodist Women while remembering the people who are dear to us.

Donations to candle burning must be received in the office by **Monday October 4** to ensure that the names honored and remembered can be listed. Checks should be written to **UMW** with "Candle Burning" noted on the memo line. (The Candle Burning Donation Form can be accessed from a link on the **Messenger**.)
