The Wesley Circle UMW program for October 14, 2021 was given by Kasey Hammock, Executive Director of First Chance for Children and Verena Wilkerson, their new **Diaper Bank** Coordinator. Verena is running the Baby Bags program which coordinates diaper wrapping events, diaper drives, and diaper distribution through partner agencies such as Voluntary Action Center, Parents as Teachers, or any agency already servicing a family. Soon we plan to establish a partnership with **The Wardrobe** to distribute diapers once a month to Tuesday clients with infants and toddlers. Circle members brought diapers, wipes, or cash donations for First Chance for Children as they learned of the extreme need for families in the 9 county service area for this critical diaper program. First **Chance for Children** also provides Safe Cribs, Baby U (a home visitation program for families below the 200% of poverty line) as well as **Lend** & Learn Libraries for families. UMW SUNDAY

United Methodist Women's Sunday was observed at all three services on Sunday October 10, 2021.Unit President, June **DeWeese,** spoke at all three services to tell the story of UMW.

During the services the observance of Candle Burning was held. The practice of candle burning is a longstanding tradition among United Methodist Women. Each year a Sunday is named to honor the work of United Methodist Women locally, nationally, and internationally. Especially noted is the **mission** work that is done by the organization. The national office of **UMW** calculates the amount of money that is needed to provide mission each year down to the second. In 2021, the amount is \$20.23 per minute. The tradition of the Candle Burning ceremony is to offer donations to mission in honor or in memory of someone close to your heart, or to the work of mission in general. When those donations are received, the total amount is divided by the mission minute amount named for the year and the candle is burned for that number of minutes. The observation of candle burning is a beautiful way to contribute to the mission work of United Methodist Women while remembering the people who are dear to us.


