Each year **Searcy-Feely** circle supports the program through **VAC** that helps to provide Christmas gifts and food to families in need. This year, **we supported a single mother and her four children providing over \$400.00** for the purchase of gifts and food.

After three years of hiatus, the circle organized a **pecan sale in October.** We were delighted to receive **106** pre-orders for pecans. In addition, we were able to sell the remaining pecans one Sunday in the connector which enabled us to sell all of the **600** bags of pecans ordered. The entirety of the \$1,680.00 of profit will be donated to four local missions: Wilkes Boulevard UMC for



Turning Point; Wilkes Boulevard UMC for the emergency shelter; LOVE Columbia; and the Central Pantry of the Food Bank of Central and Northeast Missouri.

In **November**, circle members served the community by providing a meal for **Loaves and Fishes**. **Volunteers** reported that **125 people** were served. College students and some helpful men assisted in serving!


